COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND LEADING SCHOOL CHANGE CERTIFICATE

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All schools, but especially schools serving high poverty, racially and ethnically diverse populations, need staff that are able to engage effectively with the communities that they serve. Research has shown that schools that build on the assets of their communities are able to teach in more relevant ways, empower families and children, support families and children more effectively, and enable more students to learn at higher levels.

Through examining sociological theory, understanding the concept of professional learning communities, and implementing action research initiatives, participants will increase their capacity for community engagement and school change. By responding to community needs and seeing the school community as possessing valuable assets, there will be more authentic change that reflects the voices and values of each community. Participants will learn how to build successful change from the bottom up, empowering students, families and community members to become the drivers of positive change.

Courses will provide participants with:

- A sociological understanding of the race and class dynamics shaping the school communities that they serve
- · Tools for developing an asset-based understanding of the students and families with which they work
- · Skills for making changes to improve the ways in which schools serve and are accountable to their students, families, and communities

Courses may be transferred as electives into a full Master's degree in Transformational Educational Leadership in the Department of Instructional Leadership and Professional Development (ILPD) at Towson University.
