The minor in Asian Studies is designed for students majoring in another discipline, yet interested in acquiring knowledge of Asian nations and cultures.

Requirements for the Asian Studies Minor

- Lower-level courses: A minimum of 6 units and a maximum of 9
 units may be taken at the 100 or 200 level. At least two must be from
 different disciplines. One lower-level language course may be applied
 toward the lower-level courses.
- Upper-level courses: A minimum of 12 units from at least three different disciplines. Language courses above 202 may count as one of the disciplines.
- Foreign Language: There is no language requirement for the Asian Studies minor; however, students are encouraged to begin study of an Asian language.
